Who is ALICE?

CAUW's work prioritizes the **ALICE population**. **ALICE stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed ---** households that earn above the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) but cannot afford the basic cost of living in their parish. Despite struggling to make ends meet, ALICE households often do not qualify for public assistance.

*2024 ALICE Update from 2022 Data Findings

Of Louisiana's 1,799,695 households in 2022, 19% earned below the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) and 32% were ALICE households that earned above the FPL but not enough to afford the basics in the communities where they live. Together, 50% of households in Louisiana were below the ALICE Threshold (poverty + ALICE divided by total households).

Above ALICE Threshold: (rounded) 50%; Poverty: 18.8%; ALICE: 31.5%.

While the COVID-19 pandemic brought employment shifts, health struggles, and school & business closures, it also spurred temporary expansion of public assistance through pandemic relief measures (which then reverted to pre-pandemic levels in 2022). In 2019, 879,488 households in Louisiana were below the ALICE Threshold; by 2022, that number had changed to 906,515.

VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (VITA)

The IRS's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program offers free basic tax return preparation to individuals who earn \$60k or less annually.

This year, thanks to the help of over 130 volunteers, 6,317 tax returns were completed via VITA volunteers and MyFreeTaxes bringing \$7,769,641 dollars back into the community.



BANK ON BATON ROUGE

Bank On Baton Rouge is an Economic Mobility initiative that serves those in need of second chance bank accounts, provides FREE financial literacy education, as well as exploring FinTech (Financial Technology) programs for the Greater Baton Rouge area.

This year, 412 people participated in 15 financial education workshops, 48 clients were served through 1-1 financial coaching and over 1,500 people were informed through 20 community outreach events.

UNITED WE FEED

United We Feed is a Basic Needs Initiative that leverages corporate and community partnerships to provide fresh food access to our community's ALICE and poverty populations.

This year, CAUW helped connect 1,950 families & 7,800 individuals to 39,000 lbs of fresh produce thanks to over 110 volunteers with a total of 419 volunteer hours.

SINGLECARE PRESCRIPTION DISCOUNT CARDS

SingleCare partners with pharmacies nationwide to provide customers with a lower price on prescriptions.

This year, CAUW helped 2,588 individuals save over \$291,616.40 dollars.

UNITED4VETS

United4Vets aims to coordinate, streamline, and provide wrap-around services to veterans and their families.

In collaboration with Mayor-President Sharon Weston Broome of East Baton Rouge Parish and The Mayor's Advisory Council on Veteran Affairs, CAUW was able to provide local resources to 75 veterans through the Mayor's Veterans Day Breakfast Celebration. Each veteran was given a food voucher, gas card, and additional information on local resources.

Care Coordination Services

Since the inception in 2022 of care coordination services at United Way 211/CAUW, 870 households have received coordinated assistance, connecting them to critical health and human services to meet their needs. Our care coordinators follow a closed-loop system ensuring referrals are followed up upon and outcomes are tracked. CAUW remains committed to continuing this valuable work and expanding our reach to help additional ALICE households.


